A mission is a special task that a person or group is in charge of getting done.

Eternity means endless life after death.

The church's mission is to change what happens in eternity for many people.

Basic questions:

What is a mission?

Who has Jesus put in charge of His mission that will change eternity?

**Your mission is to break the gates, and rescue them for Me!
I gave My Spirit, Word and prayer, and My name's authority.**



Basic questions:

What are gates made for? (either keep people in or keep people out)

What do Satan's gates mean in this verse?

Why does Jesus want us to break through the enemy's gates?

How can people get out from under Satan's power?

What is the mission (special job) Jesus has given us?

Advanced question:

What did Jesus give us to help us complete our mission?

How does each of these help us?

**I give every believer this important mission:
My final command to all My Church is called: the Great Commission!**

**GO and make disciples of people in each nation,
GO to where the people are, in each and every location.**

Matthew 28:19-20

A commission is an order
to complete something.

Basic questions:

Why do we call this mission the Great
Commission?

Did Jesus say to wait in a building and invite
people to come?

Where does God want you specifically to go to
make disciples in your life right now? If you
don't know, pray and ask Him to show you.

Advanced question:

Read Matthew 28:16-20

What did Jesus say had been given to Him so that His
followers could go?

**Baptize them in the name of the Father, Son, and Spirit,
Teach them to obey, all My word as they hear it.**

**I'm surely with you always, to the very end,
To help you with this mission, on Me you can depend!**

Matthew 28:19-20



When people believe in Jesus, they are baptized to show they have become a part of Jesus' Church. Going under the water represents our old sinful life being washed away. Coming up out of the water shows that we are starting a new life with Jesus.

Basic questions:

Whose name are believers baptized in? Why?

What do we need to teach new believers to do?

Where is Jesus going to be while we are on this mission?

Advanced question:

Read Matthew 28:19-20

What are some ways that children can work on this mission?

**I sacrificed My very life to start this mission of love;
I humbled Myself to be human, leaving My power up above.**

Philippians 2:7

**Then I died a criminal's death when sin was put on Me.
I took the punishment so you could live eternally.**

Philippians 2:8; Isaiah 53:5; Romans 3:23



To humble yourself is to give up being more important than others.

A criminal is someone who has broken the law.

During Jesus' time on earth, the Roman government used crosses to kill criminals.

Basic questions:

Jesus lived in heaven as God, with all His power.

What powers did Jesus have to leave in heaven to become human?

- omnipotent: all-powerful
- omnipresent: everywhere
- omniscient: all-knowing

Read Romans 3:23

What is the payment for sin?

Since Jesus paid the price for sin, what do we get?

**If you love Me and are thankful for My sacrifice for you,
Take up your daily cross and lay your life down too.**

**Don't live your life just for yourself, but choose to pay the cost.
Accept the Great Commission, and help Me save the lost.**

Matthew 16:24-26



To take up your cross is to be willing to suffer (like being uncomfortable or embarrassed)

To lay down your life means to give up what you want for what God wants.

Basic questions:

Since Jesus gave up everything for us, what should we do for Him?

If we live to just entertain ourselves and do what we want, what won't we do?

Will you join Jesus' mission to save the people of the world?

What will you do differently to work on His mission?

Advanced question:

Read Matthew 16:24-26

What will the consequences be if you choose to live for yourself instead of Him?

Read: Mark 16:15–20

Write: What help does this passage tells us we have as we go out to reach the world?

Pray: Submit yourself to God today as a member of Jesus' Church, and ask Him to use you to minister to people.

Day 5 | My daily scripture and prayer

Read: Ephesians 2:10

Write: Summarize this verse in your own words.

Pray: Submit yourself to God today as a member of Jesus' Church, and ask Him to use you to minister to people.

Day 6 | My daily scripture and prayer

Read: John 8:31–32

Write: According to this passage, how can we tell if someone is a disciple of Jesus?

Pray: Submit yourself to God today as a member of Jesus' Church, and ask Him to use you to minister to people.

Day 7 | My daily scripture and prayer

Read: 2 Timothy 2:20–21

Write: What does this passage tell us we can do to be ready to be used by God?

Pray: Submit yourself to God today as a member of Jesus' Church, and ask Him to use you to minister to people.
